## **Our Keynote Speaker: Matt Minahan**

Matt Minahan has more than 30 years' experience working with senior executive teams on enterprise-wide change programs to meet new business challenges in their external and internal environments, develop new business strategies, and redesign their organizations from the bottom to the top.



These change programs often include Action Research based interviews and focus groups, a frank self-assessment by the organization of its strengths and weakness, stakeholder analysis, external benchmarking, and work on alignment among the organization's business strategy, values, mission, and leadership philosophy.

Matt has also taught OD Leadership Consulting skills to practitioners around the world.

Matt served on the Board of Trustees of the Organization Development Network for seven years from 2009 to 2015, including as vice chair, co-chair, and chair. He is also an active volunteer and former board member of NTL Institute and the Chesapeake Bay OD Network.

He completed his doctorate at The George Washington University in OD. He holds adjunct faculty appointments in the Doctorate in Strategic Leadership Program at Philadelphia University, and in the MSOD program in the School of Public Affairs at American University in Washington, DC. He is also a visiting scholar at Cabrini University and at other several doctoral programs.
